If the product has already been replaced once by the manufacturer at no charge, all other warranty replacements will be offered at a prorated cost per the Pro-rata schedule. Detailing/Washing charges, loss of time, inconvenience, or ANY CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES do not apply!

Its intended purpose is to give your RV added protection from dirt, dust and the sun's harmful UV rays that cause fading. There are specific conditions not covered by your warranty. They include modifications or alterations, rips, tears, puncture holes, damage caused by animals, fire, flood, ice, wind and vandalism. Covers damaged by any of the above stated items will not be accepted back for credit or warranty. **No Exceptions.**

IMPORTANT!!!

Please Read Instructions Thoroughly **Before Using Your Cover**

Before using your cover, be sure to check your RV for sharp edges that could tear or puncture holes in the cover. Some problem areas are around awning locks, radio antennas, satellite antennas, rain gutters, ladders, etc.


If you locate sharp edges that cannot be altered, you need to place a protective barrier between any sharp edges and your cover. Examples: towel, rag, foam pad, etc. Stationary antennas need to be removed or positioned down before using your cover. If necessary you may need to pad antenna so it won't tear or puncture through your cover.

CAUTION:


Do not attempt to put cover on during strong winds. Do not install with seams facing out.

Cover is rolled up **back to front**. Both ends of cover, front and back are NOT the same and have been labeled to indicate front and rear.


When unfolding, place cover in the center of roof toward the front of RV. Unroll the front 1/3 of cover and allow front of cover to drape down over front of RV. (See fig 1)



Unfold sides and allow them to fall down over each side of the RV and drape down. Take care to not install inside out. (See fig 2)



Moving front to back, unroll the rest of cover working your way back to the rear of coach and the ladder. Be mindful of where vents, A/C and antennas are as you unroll and unfold cover to avoid damaging roof vents, etc. (See fig 3)




After cover is evenly spread out, walk around coach and adjust as needed. If cover is caught or hung up on something, you may need to lift over obstruction(s). Do not force cover over obstructions and risk tearing.

Both ends have elastic sewn in the bottom edge. It should be pulled down and under front and rear bumpers.


INTEGRATED HOLD-DOWN SYSTEM

(figures 4A, B, C, D, & E)

Camco Gold Coast RV Product's unique Hold Down system makes it easy to secure your RV cover. First bend the bendable strap end to form a hook (See Fig 4A and 4B).




Pull the tie down taut. Temporarily tie using a slip knot as shown (See Fig 4E). Repeat for all tie-downs. Do not over tighten. The bendable hooks are made of aluminum, and the attached elastic tensioners must not be over stressed when installed or these hooks may be forced open under windy conditions. The tensioners should be installed so that they maintain a "pull" on the tie-down, but still have some stretch left over to absorb any additional stress.



Once you are satisfied with the fit of the cover (i.e. properly centered on the RV), the tie downs can be permanently tied using two half hitch knots and the excess strap material trimmed.

If your coach has a swept back front design be sure to fold excess material down towards center of coach and secure with Tie-Downs as shown. (fig 5)



Covers are equipped with reinforcement flaps that have an integrated strap buckle. Cinch up to take up extra material (there are two sets of flaps and buckles for the front and back of the cover). Snap both sets of buckles together and then pull on the straps to tighten.

CAUTION: DO NOT OVERTIGHTEN the bungee tie-downs or the front and back straps. Seams can cause friction damage to the soft rubber roofs of RV if the cover is too

Covers are for storage *only* and not to be used for towing.

Your RV cover has been fabricated using the finest material and workmanship. To prolong its lifetime and performance you will need to consider its #1 enemy: WIND! It is important to periodically check the cover to make sure it is properly secured, especially during and after high winds.

A loose cover flapping in the wind will damage, chafe and eventually wear through the cover in stressed areas. By using the self adjusting Tie-Downs and making sure loose areas of the cover are secure and not allowed to blow out or flap against sharp objects, your cover will perform to its fullest potential.

Likewise, proper storage of cover will add to its life. If cover is badly soiled, hose off and allow to dry completely before refolding for storage.

All covers include a handy storage bag.
